

# Holiday Recipes FROM TAA Sausage Rolls Nein

#### INGREDIENTS

- Pan sausage (1 or 2 rolls)
- Velveeta Cheese—as much as you desire
- Frozen bread dough

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Thaw bread overnight in refrigerator or according to bag directions.
- 2. Brown sausage and drain.
- 3. Melt Velveeta (cubed) in browned sausage (add peppers and onion etc. as desired).
- 4. Roll out thawed bread dough and spoon sausage in middle all the way down and pinch back together thoroughly. Place (pinched side down) on greased cookie sheet pan and bake according to directions on bread dough bag.

# Neiman Marcus Dip

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 cup shredded mild Swiss cheese (e.g. Jarlsberg)
- 8 strips bacon, diced, fried until crispy and drained
- 1/3 cup sliced or slivered almonds, toasted in the oven
- 4 green onions, sliced
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon onion powder
- 1 teaspoon hot sauce (e.g. Tabasco), optional for a touch of heat

#### INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Place all of the ingredients in a mixing bowl and stir until combined. Cover and refrigerate for at least 2 hours before serving to let the flavors develop. Let the dip sit at room temperature for 15-20 minutes before serving.
- 2. Serve with crackers, corn chips, slices of crispy bread, or veggies.

# Frozen Hot Chocolate Martini

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 4 (1-ounce) envelopes hot cocoa mix, divided
- 3 cups milk
- 3/4 cup vanilla vodka
- 6 cups ice
- 1/4 cup mini marshmallows, for garnish

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Empty 1 envelope hot cocoa mix onto a saucer. Put some water into another saucer. Dip the rims of 4 martini glasses into the water and shake off any excess. Dip them in the hot cocoa mix. (Save the remainder for garnish.)
- 2. In a blender, combine the remaining the hot cocoa mix, milk, vodka, and ice and blend until smooth. Divide the mixture among the prepared glasses and garnish with the marshmallows and remaining cocoa mixture.




